## Directions to Camp CoBeAc

- **From I-75:** I-75 to M-55 (exit 227), follow M-55 west into Prudenville, turn left on Reserve Road at McDonalds, CoBeAc on the left 2 miles.
- **From 127:** US-127 expressway to M-55 Houghton Lake exit, follow M-55 east for 6 miles to Reserve Road at McDonalds and turn right. CoBeAc on left 2 miles or take Snow Bowl Road exit east to Old 27, go north to Emery Road, turn right and go to South Reserve Road and turn right; CoBeAc is on the left.
